"Come Away to a Desert Place" In every life, there is need for a balanced rhythm of work and re-creation. With so much pain and suffering in our world, the demands of living a gospel way of life can overwhelm us and cause us to act as though everything depends on us. While we can never really escape the responsibility of being there for those in need, today's gospel reminds us that there is a time for being out on mission and a time for being with the one who calls and sends us.

21st July 2024 ~ 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

Focus on the Scriptures

The apostles have been busy-preaching, healing and driving out the "demons" as instructed. They now report back to Jesus with an account of their activities. Jesus listens and invites them to take time to rest and recuperate. The implication is that they have truly given themselves to the mission. "Come away to a desert place all by yourselves and rest a while" is the invitation that he extends to them. The reference to desert evokes the wilderness of Sinai through which the people of Israel are said to have travelled for forty years. For the contemporary reader, it evokes the diversity of life in the desert, on the one hand, and the desertification of so much of the earth's surface as a result of tree-clearing and mindless destruction of forests on the other.

The "rest" that Jesus proposes is short-lived: the crowds pursue him. His response to these crowds is a physical one: he is "moved with compassion". The Greek verb for being moved with compassion suggests a "gut" reaction in Jesus: he is physically affected in the depths of his being by the plight of the people who are "like sheep without a shepherd", and he is ready to do something about it. As the story continues, we find Jesus inviting his disciples to accept responsibility for relieving the hunger of the people in the desert. "You give them something to eat" is his instruction to those who would turn the people away.

Like the Israelites of old, the afflicted Earth community in any age needs good leaders or "shepherds" who will "practice justice and righteousness in the land", as the first reading from the prophet Jeremiah reminds us. The Hebrew word for justice refers to justice in the law courts. The word for righteousness is about right relationship at every level. Jesus demonstrates for his disciples and for us what justice and righteousness entail.

As the gospel story unfolds, we find that Jesus' disciples are well-meaning, though slow to learn. They are a bit like us in that. The more we take time to reflect, however, the more likely we are to respond with the compassionate heart of the "shepherd", and the more likely we are to achieve lasting justice and right relationship in a world of unconscionable disparities and unprecedented displacement of peoples and of other-than-human species.

REPORT ON THE MEETING OF THE MERGING OF PARISHES INTO A MINISTRY DISTRICT

This gathering was to begin the process of listening to a way forward in working together to merge parishes into a Ministry District. The process of forming the districts has taken place in most areas of the Diocese in recent years. Ross Wheatland, the Diocesan Business Manager, chaired the meeting. Meeting began with Acknowledgement of Country and prayer to the Holy Spirit for guidance and wisdom.

Parish District Map (See below, middle section)

Represents the three current parishes merging into one parish.

Beaufort— Larger geographically but fewer people.

Ballarat North— More people in small area.

Cathedral—Largest group of people in reasonably small area.

Time line: of Future Parish Merge

Parish activity will remain operating independently for the immediate future, but in time the parishes will come together as one, with a projected date of merger 1st July 2025. Through a position of collaboration, the parishes will work towards a harmonious grouping. There are many gifts and talents in the communities and many experts in various fields. The Priests want to use the expertise of the Laity as we explore the merging of the parishes.

Parish Council and Finance Committee

There are two crucial areas of consideration: Pastoral and Financial. There has already been some communication between the priests, parish council members and finance committee members of each parish.

Finance Committees of all three parishes will formally come together by September 2024 and begin the discernment of a combined finance council. Independent finance council operations will continue at the same time.

A meeting, no later than September 2024, will be held with 2 nominated representatives of each parish council and one representative from a parish school to reflect on the make-up of a future Combined Parish Council.

Naming of New Parish There needs to be a naming of the New Ministry District— a working party will be formed to receive suggestions before any decision is discerned. Nominations for two representatives for each parish will be sought for the naming working party. With the first meeting of the working party to be conducted by September 2024. Each community will retain the name of the parish Church/Cathedral, e.g. St John the Baptist, St Columba's and St Patrick's.

150th Anniversary of the Diocese of Ballarat – Formation In preparation for the Diocesan Assembly in November 2024, there will be formation sessions held around the diocese with a focus on leadership and governance. In 2023, Bishop Paul asked parishes to focus on leadership in their local communities, either by forming or developing further a parish council or leadership team according to local circumstances. The Diocesan Assembly will bring together clergy, representatives of the leadership teams in parishes, schools and Catholic organisations to consider how we might develop leadership and governance in our communities in the future. The formation opportunity is for Clergy in parishes, Parish Leadership Team/Parish Councils, School Leadership Teams/School Advisory Councils, Catholic Organisations Leaders. An invitation is also extended to people who have leadership potential and who would like to participate. Leadership teams are invited to nominate others who might benefit from this experience. Fr Justin Driscoll will facilitate the formation sessions.
