News In Brief: Synod in Rome: Every Christian, whether a layperson or member of the clergy, has a vital role to play in advancing the mission of the Church through collaboration, Pope Francis said. We priests are not the bosses of the laity, but their pastors,' he said in a video message for his October prayer intention: 'For a shared mission. 'Christians are called to follow Jesus not with 'some people above others or some to one side and the rest to another side, but by complementing each other,' 'We are community. That is why we must walk together on the path of synodality.'

- As the first gathering of Pope Francis' Synod of Bishops is set to begin on Oct. 4, Latin American and U.S. Latino theologians are recognizing influences from the pope's Latin American roots in the theology and methodology.
- The second session of the Synod of Bishops on synodality, set to bring 368 bishops, priests, religious and laypeople to the Vatican, will begin by asking forgiveness for various sins on behalf of all the baptized.
- As synod members did before last year's session, they will spend two days on retreat before beginning work; that period of reflection will conclude Oct. I with a penitential liturgy presided over by Pope Francis in St. Peter's Basilica, the Vatican announced.
- The liturgy will include time to listen to the testimonies of three people: one who suffered from the sin of abuse, one from the sin of war and third from the sin of indifference to the plight of migrants.
- Seattle Archbishop Paul Etienne will take part in the Oct. 4-29 Synod of Bishops in Rome. "I have spent the past several weeks renewing my prayer life, longing for greater receptivity to the voice of the Holy Spirit."
- The Vatican is asking all baptized people, regardless of whether they will be in Rome to participate in October's assembly of the Synod of Bishops with their prayers.

Dear Father,

Fr Michael O'Toole will soon be coming to his 75th birthday, the usual time for retirement from the responsibilities of Parish Priest. Father Michael is currently Parish Priest of Colac, Parish Priest of Apollo Bay and Supervising Priest of Cororooke. I have asked Father Michael to continue in his present roles till the end of this year and Father Michael has generously agreed to this. In view of Father Michael's retirement at the end of the year, I would like to invite expressions of interest in taking up the combined roles of Parish Priest of Colac, Parish Priest of Apollo Bay and Supervising Priest of Cororooke. Mark Bromley has prepared profiles of each of these parishes. If you would be interested in being considered for appointment to these parishes, please send your expression of interest to me by email by Friday October 18. In consultation with our Diocesan Personnel Board, I will consider the expressions of interest with a view to making an appointment to take effect in January 2025. Bishop Paul Birds' Communion from the Chalice ~ Sat 28th Sept.

Dear People of the Diocese,

In the early days of the Covid pandemic, one of the adjustments made was suspending the practice of sharing communion from the chalice. As Covid restrictions have been lifted, some have asked me about reintroducing the option of Communion from the chalice in our diocese of Ballarat. In the diocese of Ballarat, communities may reintroduce the option of communion from the chalice from November 1st this year. From All Saints Day, local communities will be free to offer communion from the chalice to any of the faithful who wish to take this option. However, the common aim is to allow the faithful to receive Christ under the appearance of wine as well as under the appearance of bread, following the words of Jesus "Take and eat" and "Take and drink". In this way, communion is more clearly a sign of sharing in Christ's heavenly banquet. In making the chalice available, care should be taken to follow good hygiene practices. May the revival of this practice enrich our celebration of communion with Christ and with one another.
