Dear Friends,

Today's gospel speaks of the second coming of the Son of God, it also known as the end of the world. The scenes of terrible destruction, among them, the darkening of the sun and the moon and the disappearance of the stars from heaven, call to mind a great fear. Hence the focus of Jesus is not the disaster that happens but the new life that begins. He points to the fig tree: in winter the tree sheds its leaves and looks dead. But when winter is past, it sprouts leaves and soon produces fruits. Here Jesus is preparing his disciples for the dawning of a new era in human history after the earthly powers have passed away - it will actually be God's era in human history. All the people of God, who are faithful to the gospel will enter the glory of God and all will be made whole.

The church prepares us to reflect on the second coming of Jesus as we are going to celebrate the Feast of Christ the King next Sunday. Hence, we look forward with great joy to the coming of the son of man as the Christ the King to take us all into the everlasting kingdom of Joy and happiness. -Neville



Bishop Paul has informed parishes of the option of reintroducing communion from the chalice in parishes in the Diocese of Ballarat. ...From All Saints Day, local communities will be free to offer communion from the chalice to any of the faithful who wish to take this option. I leave it to the judgment of the Parish Priest or Administrator in each place to arrange when and how communion is offered from the chalice. The practices may vary from place to place. However, the common aim is to allow the faithful to receive Christ under the appearance of wine as well as under the appearance of bread, following the words of Jesus "Take and eat" and "Take and drink". In this way, communion is more clearly a sign of sharing in Christ's heavenly banquet.
