FROM OUR ASSISTANT PRIEST

Advent literally means 'coming' or 'arrival.' It is a reminder that Jesus is coming to collect us. We are not made for this world. We must be ready to go to that place God has prepared for us. We travel light, with a measured pace, eyes on Heaven.

Medieval Christians often went on pilgrimage to the Holy Land or to Saint James' tomb. These long and arduous walks were a way to keep a promise, to perform penance, or to find the meaning of one's life. Over 250,000 people still walk the Camino de Santiago each year including some Sunraysia parishioners. By the mere fact of walking every day for many hours, every *peregrino* comes back changed. We moderns have lost the sense of walking. We tend to drive or fly. We talk more about personal fulfilment, professional development, and financial goals.

Long walks remind us of our human condition: the important journey we are all of us embarked upon. What is really important is not career advancement or material possessions, but our end goal of Heaven, and the relationships we foster on the way.

This is also the purpose of Advent. To prepare well for Christmas we must slow down. Walk, don't race, to the finish line!

Priest: Let us now pray for God's blessing upon us and upon this wreath.

PAUSE IN SILENCE

All: Lord God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: hope of the peoples, the Saviour of every nation. You ask us to be watchful and alert because we do not know when you will come.

Let this candle bring us light and call us to a new wakefulness. At those times when you ask us to act, give us strength to respond at once.

Priest: Loving God, let your blessing come upon us gathered around this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

THE FIRST CANDLE IS LIT

All: Loving God, You call us all to be your people united in faith. We thank you for this wreath, the evergreen sign of your faithful love.

We light this candle in hope, the hope of our coming Saviour, Jesus. Dispel the darkness of sin, that the light and joy of Jesus may shine in this waiting world.

Let us prepare, then, the way of the Lord. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. When these things begin to take place, stand erect, hold your heads high, because your liberation is near at hand.

'Watch yourselves, or your hearts will be coarsened with debauchery and drunkenness and the cares of life, and that day will be sprung on you suddenly, like a trap. For it will come down on every living man on the face of the earth. Stay awake, praying at all times for the strength to survive all that is going to happen, and to stand with confidence before the Son of Man.'
