#### Focus on the Scripture

It is not easy to recognise a true prophet. Frequently those with prophetic insight are treated without honour. The people to whom Ezekiel was sent were hard of face, obstinate of heart, a rebellious house. The Galileans who heard Jesus' words were no better. They questioned his authenticity because they thought he was no better than they were and, therefore, he had no right to act superior. We so often resent people who can do what we cannot. This resentment can be magnified when the person is someone with whom we have grown up, a member of the family or of the community.

True believers recognise and admit their human frailty. They also know that genuine weakness does not impede the saving action of God. In fact, God seems to prefer to act where pride and

self-satisfaction do not prevail, for such attitudes are obstacles to personal transformation. However, when we open ourselves in humility and honest piety, the power of God can flood our minds and our hearts and shine forth from us to all around. When this happens, there will be no doubt in any mind as to the origin of this wondrous reality. It will be very clear that though it comes through us, it comes from God. The receptivity of Paul in this matter is in sharp contrast to the rebellion of the people at the time of Ezekiel and the resistance of those who thought that they knew Jesus so well.



Today's gospel reminds us that we can fail to see the value of those with whom we are very familiar. Although we proclaim that we seek the face of Christ in the face of those we meet it may not at times occur to us to look on our family and close friends in the same way. It may seem unlikely that God might come to us in the guise of a family member. Perhaps next time we are irritated by a brother or sister or the overly protective actions of a parent we should remind ourselves that we are looking into the face of God.

### reduce reuse recycle rethink repurpose

Save energy at home: Much of our electricity and heat are powered by coal, oil and gas. Use less energy by reducing your heating and cooling use, switching to LED light bulbs and energy-efficient electric appliances, washing your laundry with cold water, or hanging things to dry instead of using a dryer. Improving your home's energy efficiency, through better insulation for instance, or replacing your oil or gas furnace with an electric heat pump can reduce your carbon footprint by up to 900 kilograms of CO2e per year.

#### St Patrick's Cathedral

In March this year, LOUD fence ribbons were removed from the St Patrick's Cathedral fence following consultations between members of LOUD fence and representatives of St Patrick's Cathedral Parish, to allow maintenance work to be undertaken. While maintenance work was undertaken, Parish Council and LOUD fence representatives began discussions for a long-term memorial on the grounds of St Patrick's Cathedral to acknowledge victim survivors, their loved ones and supporters who experienced child sexual abuse in church settings and elsewhere.

We hope that the memorial will provide ongoing recognition of those who experience the ongoing impacts of child sexual abuse, be a reminder for the continuing attention to safeguarding children and vulnerable people in the community and promote healing across the Ballarat community.

Parish representatives gathered with LOUD fence members at 11 am today. Saturday July 6 to tie ribbons to the dedicated section of fence.

This discussion will be facilitated by Fr Justin Driscoll to hear of concerns and ideas around leadership and governance. All parishioners within the greater Ballarat region are invited to come and share their wisdom.

Last weekend, Margaret McDonald shared her insights at Mass with our parish community. Margaret highlighted some comparisons to our uncertainty at what will happen in the future to our Church in general. The comparisons are that we are like the Exodus people in the old Testament symbolically being in the desert for 40 years before being able to enter the promised land, or the 40 days of the Lenten journey leading up to the Easter story, which was followed by the waiting for 40 days by anxious disciples leading to Pentecost and the concern we as a parish community are now experiencing about what is the future for our parish and for the Catholic Church as a whole. Forty is significant in Jewish tradition as a significant amount of time during which a radical transformation is wrought.

For catering we will ask if people can let us know if they are attending at a later date. Being aware that many people do not like driving at night, we will also organize transport if needed.
