15th Sunday in Ordinary Time / Year B 14th & 15th July 2018

To be a disciple of Jesus is to experience a call. It is also to be sent on a mission in partnership with others, a mission invariably expressed in terms of preaching, teaching, healing, and/or driving out of demons or unclean spirits. In other words, it is to be authorised to do what Jesus did and to proclaim what he proclaimed. When we hear of Jesus casting out demons and telling his disciples to do likewise, we tend to think that whatever they did is something that belongs to another time and has little to do with our contemporary society.

In the cosmology of the time, there was a realm between the divine and the human that was inhabited by good and evil spirits (angels and demons). The divide between these realms was conceptualised as porous so that humans could be protected by the angels or "possessed" by the demons. While the cosmology of the twenty-first century has no "place" for such beings, the contemporary imagination allows space for a metaphorical engagement with the angelic and demonic. When we speak of "demons" now, we are talking about something recognisable in human experience, even if somewhat removed from the "demons" that beset the poor in the Roman imperial provinces of the first century.

Today's parents spend much of their time casting out the "demons" that beset their children, as do our friends when they sit and listen to the pain in our hearts and help us to let go of the "demons" that so often inhabit our psyches. Many health professionals are paid to heal the hurts as well as the cuts and burns. They drive out the demons of fear and hate and prejudice and of paralysing mental illness. Educators also, aware that learning occurs only when students are relatively free from fear and anxiety, know what it means to drive out the demons.

It is significant that Jesus instructs the disciples to travel light. They need the basics to live and to do their job, but if their mission is to be effective, they must be free from the anxiety that comes from excess. Psychologist and social critic John F. Schumacher suggests that societies with the most material goods tend to be the most anxious. "Mutual respect, community-mindedness, an eagerness to share, reverence for nature, thankfulness and love of life", it seems, are the major ingredients for a stressor "demon"-free personal and community life. There would be no need to shake the dust from our feet for want of hospitality if that were the way we all

What's more, there would be enough for all on our planet, the human and other-andhuman, to live in dignity and peace.



CALL TO ACTION: Removal of support payments for people seeking asylum

"Every stranger who knocks at our door is an opportunity for an encounter with Jesus Christ, who identifies with the welcomed and rejected strangers of every age (Matthew 25:35-43)"

– Pope Francis, Message for the 104th World Day of Migrants and Refugees 2018

The problem

The Australian Government is currently removing basic support payments for a significant number of people seeking asylum. This will have a devastating effect on many vulnerable people in our community.

Changes to the Government's eligibility criteria for Status Resolution Support Services (SRSS) payments mean that over 7,000 people will lose their sole, basic source of income. SRSS payments are provided to people who are actively working to resolve their immigration status, usually people awaiting a decision on their claims for refugee status. Payments are reserved for those without any other income

support and amount to only 89% of Newstart entitlements. They are a necessary safety net for highly vulnerable people who otherwise have no way of supporting themselves

These changes come on top of the recent loss of basic support for a number of people who had been transferred to Australia from Manus Island and Nauru for medical treatment.

New eligibility criteria for SRSS payments mean that a large proportion of people now receiving these payments will soon lose them, should the Government consider they have the ability to work. This means that many people in our community, who may be deemed 'workready' by a bureaucrat, will be left without any income whether or not they have a job.

As the Jesuit Refugee Service has noted, "The sudden removal of support payments will not assist people in finding work or becoming self-sufficient, but will instead push already vulnerable people into situations of great risk and significant stress and trauma. Charity services... will not be able to assist the additional hundreds to thousands more people in need of support.



These changes can only have a disruptive impact on our social cohesion. Ultimately, they undermine our national character, which may be judged, as St John Paul II put it, "on the basis of how it treats its weakest members". Our Catholic community is called to welcome Christ, hidden in the disguise of the 'strangers' before us (Matthew 25:35). As such, we are challenged to speak up for all those affected by these changes and make our contribution to shaping a more compassionate welcome from our nation.

As a Catholic community, we can help provide material support to those affected, as well as work together to change the hearts and minds of our policy makers.

Material support

CAPSA is ready and available to coordinate efforts across the Catholic community to help those affected by these changes.

The most immediate needs of those affected by this loss of income are housing and employment.
