FIRST SYNOD FOR ENTIRE CHURCH IN AUSTRALIA SINCE 1937

The Archbishop of Brisbane, Mark Coleridge, has unveiled plans to hold an historic plenary council of the entire Church in Australia, reports The Catholic Leader.

It is to be held in 2020, for only the fifth time in Australia's history, and 79 years after the previous plenary council meetina.

Archbishop Coleridge said bishops had agreed a plenary council or synod was needed because "we are at a time of profound cultural change. Not only in the wider community, but in the Church." "I think we have to accept the fact that Christendom is over – by which I mean mass, civic Christianity. It's over. Now, how do we deal with that fact?" Arch-

bishop Coleridge said.

"We are not the power in the land which we once were."

The last plenary council of the Church in Australia was held in 1937.

That event, and earlier ones in 1885, 1895, and 1905 were exclusively male gatherings, with only bishops, theologians, and superiors of male religious orders attending.

Women, religious and lay people took no part. Archbishop Coleridge said women in the Church would play a role in 2020.

A plenary council can discuss and legislate on a wide range of issues, including matters of faith, morals, and discipline. It can also address the critical issues of the times. "This is no time for the Church to be putting up signs that say 'business as usual'," Archbishop Coleridge said. "If we needed any proof, then the Royal Commission has shown that."

Go out to all the world and tell the Good News



REFLECTION

The vision of a disciple must be the vision of God. Disciples must see with wide analed lenses that enable them to recognise that God offers the arace of salvation to all. The passages from both Isaiah and Luke are astounding in their inclusivity. They show that God's saving grace is unbounded. It reaches out to those whom the people of God may not only distrust but sometimes even despise. There is something very dangerous about being smugly convinced of one's own salvation. When we are so sure of ourselves, we can easily fall into the error of being as sure of the moral failure of others as well. The gospel warns us against such judgment.

Women and men are gathered into the community of the saved, primarily because others have been sent out to aet them. The psalm refrain is the command to go out to the whole world. The first reading describes God sending fugitives back home to get their relatives. People come from all over because someone is sent to get them. Today that command is directed to us. We are the ones who are being sent out to bring others to God. Unfortunately there are many people who do not believe that they are fit to be evangelisers. They may think that the work that they do or the lives that they live do not lend themselves to the task of spreading the good news of the gospel. They do not realise that all Christians are called and sent. This is not an option: it is a responsibility.
