# FIRST READING from the Acts of the Apostles

Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to synagogue on the sabbath and took their seats.

When the meeting broke up, many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God had given them.

The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said:

I have made you a light for the nations, so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.'

It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside.

But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

#### REMEMBERING BISHOP RONALD MULKEARNS

Dear friends,

We are painfully aware of the criticisms of Bishop Mulkearns for his failings. At the same time, we recall all the good he did. His friends will be sad that the good has generally been forgotten. As one friend said, "He is not famous for the many things he did well; only for the one thing he did badly."

His family remembers a devoted brother and uncle. His friends recall a shy man who liked to share quiet times. Over the past few days people have spoken to me of his kindness. And this was not only people of the diocese of Ballarat. I received an email from a priest in Peru who recalled with gratitude the kindness Bishop Mulkearns showed when he visited a local parish there in the 1980's. He wrote "I only ever met Bishop Ronald once, and that was in the 80's when he came to Lima and visited our parish. Many years back, but I have never forgot his kindness to us."

Some have recalled the contribution Bishop Mulkearns made to fostering social welfare services in our region, services that grew into what is now Centacare. Others have remember how he promoted opportunities for people to study at university level.

I thank those who have contacted me over the recent weeks with their reflections following the death of Bishop Mulkearns. There are reasons for gratitude as we recall the good that he did. May he rest in peace God bless you all
