Dear Friends,

In today's gospel we saw that Jesus came to his native town with his disciples. On a Sabbath day he went to the synagogue and began to teach there. Many at the synagogue of Nazareth are surprised to hear Jesus. They question his family background, doubt his teaching and asked themselves where did this man get all this? They cannot accept someone they know as a son of a carpenter, whose mother and relatives are still their neighbours. There main worry was: how can he have that kind of wisdom and power of God in him. So they refuse to accept him as their Messiah.

We know God does not look at our family or social background as human does. God will always believe in us trust our goodness and commitment. After all, we belong to one family and united with our faith in God, as our heavenly Father. If our aim in life is to make 'God's will' in our life or God's plan as our plan then we should follow the footsteps of Jesus who was faithful to God's will. The people at the synagogue or their Rabbis were lack of faith and cannot perform many mighty deeds among them as Jesus did. So they refuse to accept Jesus because of his family background. The Gospel tells us what God wants from us. God desires our faith. Having faith in God means trusting God and relying on God in all situation of our life. As Jesus tells to his disciples in another occasion, 'I say to you, if you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, move from here to there, and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you. So let us ask the Lord to strengthen our faith to accept the will of God in our life and to live faithfully in our day-to-day life

Working With Children Checks

Firstly, a thank you to all ministers for their generous and dedicated work in the Parish.

We address the criteria requiring a Working With Children Check, which is set out in the publication WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK AND NATIONAL POLICE RECORD CHECK POLICY, "5.6 Any volunteer working in the Diocese, a diocesan agency or in a Parish setting who works with children or who as part of their work as a volunteer are likely to have direct contact with children shall provide a Working with Children Check Card, a copy of which shall be kept at the parish office, diocesan office or diocesan agency as applicable."

Therefore, all ministers who are in the Welcome, Sacramental Preparation and Communion to the Sick Ministries will be required to have a current Working With Children Card.
