Reflection

In the time when monks lived in the Egyptian desert, one day a certain monk committed what was considered to be a serious fault, and the elders assembled to pass judgement on him. They sent for their abbot to join them.

They sent him a message saying: 'Come, the community is waiting for you.' So the abbot arose and started off. He took with him an old basket which was full of holes. Filling it with fine sand he carried it behind him. Naturally, as he went along, he left a trail of sand in his wake.

The elders came out to meet him and asked him what he meant by this. And he replied: 'My sins are running out behind me. Everywhere I go I leave a trail of faults behind me, only most of the time I don't see them myself. And today you want me to sit in judgement on my brother.'

Jesus' double challenge to his disciples today - to renounce hypocritical judgment of others and to let their hearts bear fruits in goodness - brings to mind a 13th century prayer that became an unlikely popular song in the 1970s.

Words by Richard, Bishop of Chichester, inspired the song 'Day by Day' in the musical Godspell: 'Three things I pray, to see thee more clearly, love

thee more dearly, and follow thee more nearly, day by day.'

It's still a worthy invocation, as is Micah's succinct summary of what God asks of us: 'to act justly, to love tenderly and to walk humbly with your God.' Hand in hand, they make a worthy addition to our repertoire of daily prayer.

When I was teaching, sometimes I would ask my students to think about where they saw God in their day-to-day lives. They often found this exercise difficult because they expected God to announce his presence with angels and trumpets, spiritual experiences etc. Alternatively, they had difficulty with it because they thought that they were not 'spiritual' enough to see where God was. So I would ask them a different question: where do you see goodness, truth and beauty? They found this much easier and could identify goodness in their friends, beauty in their surroundings and so on. We even went around the school looking for goodness, truth and beauty in the canteen, the library etc. We never ran out of goodness to

At the end of this exercise, we would read... 'it is all that is good, everything that is perfect, which is given us from above; it comes down from the Father of all light' and then reflect on how we found God everywhere! (St James 1:17)

Where will you see goodness, truth and beauty in your life today? Keep your eyes open to see God.
