We celebrate **Social Justice Sunday on 27 September**. This year's Social Justice Statement is titled: 'For Those Who've Come Across the Seas: Justice for refugees and asylum seekers'.

The Statement addresses the divisive national debate over asylum seekers, especially those who arrive by boat. It reminds all Australians of the need to welcome and comfort those who have fled here from terror and danger, and to live out the example of Jesus, who never turned his back on those who were lost or suffering.

God has a **preferential** love for the **poor** that flowed so fully through the human heart of Jesus to any kind of poverty. The poverty that attracts the love of God revealed in the life of Jesus is not only material poverty—a lack of food, clothing and housing. There are at least four **other kinds** of poverty besides material poverty.

There is **bodily** poverty: a lack of health or a proper functioning of our body. There is **mental** poverty: a lack of education or a mind that does not function normally. There is **social** poverty: a lack of a voice in society or living on the margin of society. Then there is **spiritual** poverty, the deepest poverty of all: a lack of God's love surging through us to others. - Fr. John Reilly SJ
