**Making Connections:** 'To hear the teaching of the Father and learn from it is to come to me'. Are you coming closer to Jesus?

**Did you Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore.** The gospel of John contains several 'I am' sayings. When God revealed his name to Moses at the burning bush he called himself 'I am who am'. Jesus' use of this term is a pointer to his true identity as Son of God. The 'manna' of the desert experience is indeed a real phenomenon. It is a highly nutritious substance which forms in the early morning possibly from the secretions of beetles which feed on the tamarisk plant.

**Exploring the Word:** 'The Jews' are trapped in their earthly reality and cannot move beyond it into the mystery of God present among them. For 'the Jews' the gift which God gave is the Law. They cannot move into the new reality that Jesus has surpassed this and offers something greater—his flesh for the life of the world. It is through his death and resurrection that salvation will be won.

**Sharing the Tradition:** It is impossible to hear the term 'bread from heaven' without thinking of the Eucharist. For Catholics the Eucharist is 'the source and summit' of the life of the Church and the faithful.

**Living the Word:** Bread or, more specifically, food is vital for humans to live. Jesus presents himself as the true food, the source of life for all those who believe in him. Pray for each other and for those involved in Eucharistic ministry.

**Daily Prayer:** Guide your church, O God, on the paths of its earthly pilgrimage, and sustain with the food that does not perish so that, persevering in the faith to which Christ has called us, we may come at last to your holy mountain and gaze on the beauty of your face.

**Marriage Tip:** "Your life is more than your work and your work is more than your job." (From the song by the same name by Charlie King.) Is your 'job' getting in the way of your family relationships? Both are important, but as another song puts it, "Time is love."



**Vocational View:** To taste and see the goodness of the Lord means to be drawn closer to God.

"Try, then, to imitate God as children of His that He loves, and follow Christ by loving as He loved you." Be a presence of God's love in the world today. Do what you can to bring to life God's love.

#### The treasure of Families

That any far-reaching decisions of economists and politicians may protect the family as one of the treasures of humanity.

**Eucharist Preparation Week Four - Called and Sent Out**

In this session we are reminded that at the end of Mass we are sent out "to love and serve the Lord". As fully initiated Christians we are called into action: we are sent out to follow the example of Jesus.

The concluding words "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life" commission us to reach out to all who need to feel the tenderness of Christ's love. These words challenge us to be what our Eucharistic celebration has prepared us to be—the living body of Christ. We are transformed by Christ's love so that in turn we can go out and transform our world—in love, peace, justice and joy.

In this session the aim is for the children to gain the following understandings:

- Jesus calls his disciples to a life of love and service.
- That we are called to live out the Eucharist by loving and serving God and others as Jesus showed us.
- Ever deeper relationship with Jesus in prayer, listening to the Word of God and putting it into practice.
