Making Connections: Light has become a synonym for Christ, who refers to himself as the light of the world (John 8:12). Thus the presence of Jesus is often symbolised by a lighted candle. How does this light shine in you? Bring light to someone's life this week by a visit, a phone call, a gesture...

Did you Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore. In the early years, there was rivalry between the disciples of John the Baptist and Jesus. This gospel makes it clear that John does not see himself as a rival to Jesus but as a witness to him. It is Jesus who is the one sent from God.

Sharing the Tradition: The Church is inspired and guided by the Holy Spirit, and one of the ways we can encounter the work of the Spirit is 'in the witness of saints through whom he manifests his holiness and continues the work of salvation' (CCC§688). From the Church, a believer can 'learn the example of holiness and recognise its model', especially in 'the spiritual tradition and long history of the saints' (CCC§2030) who have given witness to Jesus, just as John the Baptist did.

Exploring the Word: In contrast to last week's text on John the Baptist, this one comes from the last of the written gospels. The Gospel of John was penned at the very end of the first century. One common characteristic, however, is clear: the Baptist is again presented as the forerunner. John the Baptist rejects all messianic or quasi-messianic titles. He throws human expectation into chaos. He claims for himself only the role of the 'voice' of Isaiah 40, but the evangelist presents him as the most reliable of witnesses, 'Sent by God...to speak for the light'. The only other person in John's Gospel to come from God is Jesus himself. Before an audience of the leaders of the religion of Israel, John witnesses with authority and truthfulness that has its source in God. How do you give witness to Christ?

Marriage Tip: "And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more." (Phil 1:9) God wants your love to grow, always.

Daily Prayer: God of peace, whose word is good news to the oppressed, healing for the broken-hearted and freedom for all who are held bound, gladden our hearts and fashion the earth into a garden of righteousness and praise! Sanctify us entirely, in spirit, soul and body, for the coming of the One who even now is among us, your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.
