FROM FR. JOHN: After 20 hours in the air and 8 by train across Spain from Barcelona, it was great to finally reach Leon on Monday afternoon where I was able to find comfortable accommodation at the Convent alberque for 6 euro, which didn't break the bank, followed by visiting beautiful Leon Cathedral then a 3 course albergue meal for 10 euro. After a day and a half cooped up travelling, when the Convent gates were unlocked at 5.30am I felt like a dog let off its chain! The 123km walk from Leon to Oviedo is called the Camino de San Salvador (Way of Our Saviour) as it's destination is the Cathedral of the Holy Saviour in Oviedo. While most pilgrims walk the various Caminos to the tomb of the apostle James in Santiago de Compostela, it is said: "The one who travels to Santiago and not to El Salvador honours the servant and ignores the master." Apart from some serious ascents and descents, the walking tracks are superb even if at times damp underfoot where wearing gumboots would be more appropriate than sandals. In Scripture the phrase "on the third day" is always significant. Appropriate that on the third day of this walk I reached beautiful Oviedo and its historic Cathedral. In addition to its spiritual significance (relics of Jesus brought here over 1,000 years ago include the Holy Shroud (his burial face cloth) and part of his Cross), Oviedo is Woody Allen's favourite European city and there's a statue of him here. With beautiful buildings, it's CBD one giant, vibrant mall and life size statues all over the place, I think he's got a great point. From Oviedo I'm now on the 307km Camino Primitivo trail to Santiago; sharing this with pilgrims from across the world including a blind, young German girl walking without companions or a guide dog. How do I know she's blind? When I walked past her up a steep, rocky track, she asked me my age and when I replied "62" she said "that's amazing, you look 20." This Camino could be subtitled "climb every mountain" but the superb views easily compensate for this. Tomorrow I set out on the "Ruta Hospitales" up and over more mountains which guide books advise "best avoided during bad weather." Thankfully with 15 degree nights and hot sunny days it looks like ideal weather for the path ahead. Fr. John.
