

Making Connections: Have you ever felt overwhelmed by the many competing demands on your time and your attention? How do you find solitude and quiet in the midst of this busyness?

Did you Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore. The image of the shepherd is often used in the Hebrew Scriptures to describe the relationship between God and his people Israel. They are the flock whom he will gather and protect. Our use of the term 'pastoral' comes from the image of Christ as the shepherd of his flock. Jesus regularly took time to be alone, to pray and to contemplate God. He invites his followers to do the same.

Exploring the Word: Jesus meets the needs of both the disciples and the crowds and thus becomes the 'good shepherd' who will look after his flock. In what ways is Jesus meeting your needs at the moment?

Sharing the Tradition: One of the symbols of a Bishop is the shepherd's crook. This symbolises his role as the pastor of his people. The Pope, as Bishop of Rome, is the first among the Bishops. While the Bishops are principal pastors of a diocese, they are assisted in their task by priests and pastoral associates who work at a more local (parish) level. The pastoral work in a parish could not be carried out without the enormous work done by volunteers from within the community. As Christians we are called to take responsibility for caring for each other.

Living the Word: Jesus invites the disciples to take time out to rest after the exertions of their mission. All the major monotheistic religious have a day which is set aside as 'a day of rest'. While Jews, Christians and Muslims designate a different day for this rest, all endorse the idea of taking time out from a busy working life to reconnect with those things which are truly important—developing our relationship with the divine.

Daily Prayer: Lord God, faithful shepherd of the flock, in Jesus you long to gather into one fold the scattered sheep, the desolate crowd, the souls bewildered and confused. Work in us and though us to fashion a new humanity, proclaiming peace to those far off, gathering many into one through Christ's glorious cross.

Eucharist Preparation Week One - Celebrating Being Christian

Remembering and celebrating stories of our faith has always been a strong tradition in the Catholic Church. These stories not only recall events and people from the Bible and history, but also give us our sense of belonging, meaning and identity as Christians. In celebrating Sunday Eucharist, commonly called the Mass, Catholics gather as a faith community to celebrate God's life giving presence in our world and especially the presence of Jesus Christ. Christ is present within the community assembled, in the Word of God, under the signs of the consecrated bread and wine and in the priest who presides.

In the session the aim is for the children to gain the following understandings:
