Making Connections: Do you now see other members of the Church as your wider family? Spend time with your own family this week and strengthen the bonds and love you have for them. Be aware and welcoming to those who may not have a strong family to turn

Did vou Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore. Scholars have long debated the nature of the relationship to Jesus of those family members mentioned in Scripture. The Catholic Church holds that Mary remained a virgin all her life and therefore those referred to here are possibly from a broader extended family of 'brethren' or kin which was a common way of referring to family in that period.

Marriage Tip: Marriage is not so much a matter of finding the right person as being the right person. Relationship skills can be learned. Try to improve yours today.

Vocational View: There is definitely evil in this world. We are surrounded by constant reminders that all is not well in our Church, our cities, our schools, our government, our environment. Each of us must use the best means to bring about love in the world. Are you part of the problem or part of the solution? Choose love!
