

What is Baptism?

Baptism is the foundation of the whole Christian life. It is the gateway to life in the Holy Spirit and the door which gives access to the other



sacraments. Baptism is a one-off event and anyone who has not previously been baptised may seek Baptism. Through Baptism a person is **reborn** as a daughter or son of God. It is through Baptism that an individual begins his or her **formal relationship** with Jesus Christ and the Church.

The phrase *to baptise* means to "plunge" or "immerse". The immersion in water, or alternatively the pouring of water over the person's head, symbolizes the baptised person's union with the death of Jesus. Just as Christ was raised from the dead, the baptised person arises from the water as a "new creature", a member of the Church.

Baptism consists of a person's immersion in water **three** times or of the pouring of water over the person's head three times, reciting the words, "I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

Those who have been validly baptised in another Christian tradition and are seeking to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church, do not need to be baptised again.
