Making Connections: Find ways this week of bringing life and nourishment to others.

Provide them with what they need. Recall significant meals you have shared. Reflect on why it is that food and drink are part of human celebrations. Imagine what a celebration would be like without the fellowship of eating and drinking together.

Did you Know?: Points of interest and Catholic lore. After the flood (Gen 6-8) God established a covenant with Noah. He promised never again to send a deluge on the Earth and said to Noah, 'every living and crawling thing shall provide food for you, no less than the foliage of plants.'

Exploring the Word: Jesus' claim that he is the living bread come from heaven is brought to a new height. Not only has he surpassed the manna given by God in the desert, he now claims that it is his flesh and blood which gives life. He insists that he makes God known because he comes from God. Eating the flesh and drinking the blood of the Son of Man will bring those who believe to eternal life—not the physical life of this world but to life with the Father forever.

Sharing the Tradition: The Church has always insisted that the bread and wine of the Eucharist are the true flesh and blood of Christ. While the appearance of bread and wine remain, in reality they become the body and blood of the Lord. St Thomas Aquinas says 'that in this sacrament are the true body of Christ and his true blood is something that cannot be apprehended by the senses but only by faith which relies on divine authority.' Christians believe that the Eucharist is more than a memorial to the Last Supper, but indeed makes Christ present to us in each Eucharistic celebration.

Living the Word: Bread is the food of life. Food is essential for our bodies to function. But food and drink also give pleasure and satisfaction. When people come together to celebrate, food and drink are part of the celebration. As food and drink are to the human person so Jesus is to those who believe in him. Reflect on the world and the 'life' that it needs today.

Daily Prayer: Here in our midst, O good and gracious God, Wisdom has built herself a house, she has set her table and mixed her wine: The flesh and blood of Christ become our food and drink. Fill us with your Spirit, so that we may be a canticle of praise to you, and for our brothers and sisters a feast of joyful love.

Marriage Tip: Self-deprecation can be disarming. Tell a silly story about yourself from your youth. If you have children, they may be relieved that you made mistakes, too. Teens often appreciate the role reversal. It might even generate an evening of reminiscing.

Vocational View: John's Gospel reveals God's promise of the Word made flesh. This is revealed through the sacrifice made by Christ: "I am the living bread, come down from heaven ... the bread I give is my flesh for the life of the world ...". Do this in memory of Him.

The gifts of bread and wine are brought forward to the altar. Members of the assembly come forward in procession—eagerly, attentively, and devoutly—to receive Holy Communion.
