17TH MARCH 2021— SAINT PATRICK

Born in Roman Britain around the end of the fourth century. Died in Ireland about the middle of the fifth century. Faced hardship as a missionary bishop in Ireland, and opposition even from his friends and fellow Christians. Yet worked to conciliate, to evangelise, and to educate local chieftains and their families. Remembered for his simplicity and pastoral care, for his humble trust in God, and for his fearless preaching of the gospel to those who had enslaved him in his youth. Specially honoured in Australia because of the many Irish people who came to settle here and brought with them the faith and zeal of St Patrick.

"Do not be afraid of being fragile but think of Lent as the transformation from ashes to <u>light</u>, from what is leftover to <u>fullness</u>... As a time that is not penitential, but <u>alive</u>, not a time of mortification, but as <u>revitalisation</u>. It is the time the seed is in the <u>earth</u>."

Caritas Arsad, an Indonesian farmer, had no toilet at home and was often sick due to the practice of open defecation. Through Caritas Australia's support, Arsad and his community improved hygiene and sanitation, and funded their own toilets.

We pray for the inspiration and courage to shine the light on global injustices, and to let our own light shine unto others, so that we may be agents of change who bring about the kingdom of God on earth.
