Making Connections: Have you ever been hasty in your judgement and condemnation of others? Is there someone who is on the outer to whom you can offer support this week?

Did You Know?: Pilgrims who came to Jerusalem for the great festivals and who could not find lodging in the city often stayed the night on the Mount of Olives, just outside the city gates. On the Mount of Olives is a garden area called Gethsemane, which means 'oil press' in Hebrew. The Mount of Olives offered a spectacular view across to the temple.

Exploring the Word: The intimacy of Jesus' address to the woman as 'Woman' echoes the term he uses in addressing his mother (John 2:4, John 19:26). Jesus neither condemns nor condones. He simply accepts the woman as she is and invites her to a new life. It is acceptance and love that allows repentance and change to occur in others.

Sharing the Tradition: Turning away from sin requires a conversion of the heart (CCC§1430). Interior repentance is a radical reorientation of our whole life, a return, a conversion to God with all our heart, an end of sin, a turning away from evil ... At the same time, it entails the desire and resolution to change one's life, with hope in God's mercy and trust in the help of his grace' (CCC§1431). 'Baptism is the principal place for the first and fundamental conversion. It is by faith in the Gospel and by Baptism that one renounces evil and gains salvation, that is the forgiveness of all sins and the gift of new life' (CCC§1427). Being a Christian demands constant re-conversion. Often we fail to live up to the promise of our new life, so we need to undergo many experiences of conversion to orient ourselves again to God.

Symbols and Images: The question posed to Jesus by the Pharisees was meant to trick him. If he condoned her stoning, the act would break Roman law; if he refused to condone it, he would be holding religious law in contempt. In his response, God, in Jesus, is offering a new way. He does not condemn the sinner but invites her to leave her past behind and begin again. The imagery of forgiveness is consistent throughout the Lenten readings.

Daily Prayer: As once in the vision, O God, your prophet summoned the spirit so that dry bones stood up alive, and as once you Son stood fearless at death's door calling Lazarus to come forth alive, raise us up with Christ from death of sin, that all of us, the elect and the baptised, may be unbound and set free.

Marriage Tip: Thank your spouse for the lifelong journey he or she chose to take with you – just because.

Vocational View: Lent is six weeks of being serious about forgiveness and knowing we are loved. Who will step forward to tell of God's great love for us?

Warrnambool Parishes, Looking Forward

With the ageing priests in the Warrnambool District discussions have begun with neighbouring Parishes about the advantages of parishes working together. Linehan at the end of 2020.

Plenary Council Update

The Listening and Dialogue phase is over. What happens now? With the *Listening and Dialogue* phase now complete, the National Centre for Pastoral Research will continue the deep listening process, conducting a qualitative and quantitative analysis of the submissions received and, using best-practice research methods, will identify key themes that have emerged. Then, in May, the Bishops Commission for the Plenary Council, the Plenary Council Executive Committee and the Facilitation Team will work together with the National Centre for Pastoral Research to finalise the National Themes for Discernment. Those themes will become the focus for the *Listening and Discernment* phase, which will begin from June 9, and will be the foundations for the Plenary Council agenda. More information about the *Listening and Discernment* phase will be available shortly. One of the key aspects of the Plenary Council 2020 is prayer.
