FROM OUR ASSISTANT PRIEST

The welcome rain we're receiving at present complements this weekend's Gospel. In practical terms seeds are as mysterious to us as they were to the people Jesus was addressing. The growth from seeds is a natural force outside of human control. God's ways are also like that: outside human control. That becomes clear to anyone who looks at Church history. Things are born small, grow to an amazing size, and then they disappear. It's a constant cycle of beginnings and endings.

Without these lessons from history, it is very easy to become proud of achievements which really belong to God. We like think to that we are indispensable, when often we are actually spanners in God's works. Once pride comes in, God runs away!

We are much more like little children, and sometimes little children are a nuisance — except that their parents invite them to 'help,' and allow the children to feel they've accomplished something.

It's not that we should devalue our work, or consider ourselves a nuisance. But I think Jesus does want us to remember that God is in control, not us. In the words of Pope Francis, "God is always the God of surprises. The Lord always surprises us. [This Gospel] is an invitation to open ourselves more generously to God's plans."



PETITION TO RETAIN THE LORD'S PRAYER IN PARLIAMENT

The Lord's Prayer has introduced proceedings at Victorian Parliament since 1857. In recent years, secularists have argued that the prayer is inappropriate for a multicultural society, and it should be replaced by a minute of silence. However, the petition to retain the Lord's Prayer is signed not just by the Catholic and Anglican dioceses in Victoria, but also the Islamic Board of Imams, the Hindu Council, and the Jewish Affairs Council. The secularist campaign to remove the Lord's Prayer is opposed by all of Victoria's multifaith communities. FIRST READING

Ezekiel 17:22-24

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

I have made the small tree great.

The Lord says this:

'From the top of the cedar, from the highest branch I will take a shoot and plant it myself on a very high mountain. I will plant it on the high mountain of Israel. It will sprout branches and bear fruit. and become a noble cedar. Every kind of bird will live beneath it, every winged creature rest in the shade of

its branches.

And every tree of the field will learn that I, the Lord, am the one

who stunts tall trees and makes the low ones grow.

who withers green trees and makes the withered green.

I, the Lord, have spoken, and I will do it.'

(R.) Lord, it is good to give thanks to you.

- 1. It is good to give thanks to the Lord to make music to your name, O Most High, to proclaim your love in the morning and your truth in the watches of the night. (R.)
- 2. The just will flourish like the palm-tree and grow like a Lebanon cedar. (R.)
- Planted in the house of the Lord they will flourish in the courts of our God, still bearing fruit when they are old, still full of sap, still green, to proclaim that the Lord is just. In him, my rock, there is no wrong. (R.)

SECOND READING 2 Corinthians 5:6-10

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

> Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing the Lord.

We are always full of confidence when we remember that to live in the body means to be exiled from the Lord, going as we do by faith and not by sight – we are full of confidence, I say, and actually want to be exiled from the body and make our home with the Lord. Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing him. For all the truth about us will be brought out in the law court of Christ, and each of us will get what he deserves for the things he did in the body, good or bad.

The seed is the word of God, Christ is the sower; all who come to him will live for ever. Alleluia!

GOSPEL

Mark 4:26-34

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

The mustard seed, the smallest of all the seeds, grows into the biggest shrub of all.

Jesus said to the crowds, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.
