DEACON CAY TRINH

My name is Cay Xuan Trinh, I come from the central part of Viet Nam. I was born in a Catholic family with 10 members, my parents and other seven siblings. I am the second oldest.



I felt the call to become a Catholic priest when I was in year ten of high school. I was strongly motivated by the former Parish Priest in my home parish. In 2015, while I was preparing for the entrance examination to join the local seminary, I received a phone call from the Auxiliary Bishop (the local bishop back in Vietnam) who asked me about discerning priesthood in Australia. I was full of fear and uncertainty because I had been invited to go out to a new land which is totally different in culture, language, perspective, and lifestyle. After times of prayer and discernment, I answered the Auxiliary Bishop that I was happy to carry on the invitation. The Bishop then introduced me to Bishop Paul Bird who was visiting Viet Nam. Bishop Paul Bird then invited me to study for the Diocese of Ballarat.

I arrived in Australia in late June 2017 and then entered the Seminary (Corpus Christi College, Melbourne) in February 2018. I was ordained a deacon for the Ballarat Diocese last December. I am looking forward to priestly ordination which will happen in late November this year.

I would like to extend my deep gratitude to all of you, especially Frs Matt and John, and other members of the parish team who have generously welcomed me to this wonderful community. I am looking forward to listening to your stories and sharing my stories as well.


JOKE OF THE DAY

REFLECTION BY NICK BRODIE

Reflecting on this Gospel passage, Pope Francis draws our attention to the 'style' of mission Jesus wanted his followers to undertake.

Firstly, the Pope reminds us that this is Jesus' mission. It is Jesus who summons the disciples. He sends them out. He instructs them. Whatever authority they have, they received from him. This means the mission is about service to and for Jesus.

As the Pope points out, this means that 'the Apostles have nothing of their own to proclaim, nor any abilities to manifest.' Rather, 'they speak and act as "emissaries", as messengers of Jesus.' Every Christian is called to reflect this style of apostolic mission, 'radiating from a centre, reaffirming the presence and work of Jesus.' We manifest this through the things we do – visiting, helping, healing.

The way we do such works is important too. This is the Pope's second point. The style of Jesus' mission should have the 'face', or look, or feel, of Jesus. Our good work is hindered when we are cloaked in sanctimony or self-concern or when we are burdened by fear of change or failure.

We are pilgrims, the Pope says, 'not celebrities on tour'. Our mission will be most effective when it is authentically modest, 'free and unhampered, without reserves and without favours.' Confident in Jesus, we are called to be what the Pope calls 'humble workers of the Kingdom'.
