
-BALLARAT DIOCESE: 150TH ANNIVERSARY: Preparation for the Diocesan Assembly in November 2024: Fr. Justin Driscoll at the invitation of Bishop Paul Bird is facilitating formation sessions being held around the Diocese with a focus on leadership & governance. Sessions have been held already in Horsham, Mildura, Robinvale & Colac (last Tuesday) Still to be conducted in Ballarat & Warrnambool) 50 people attended last Tuesday – with parishioners from Coragulac, Donald, Maryborough, Ballarat & Colac. Julie & Jane from the Diocesan Office of Pastoral Planning accompanied Fr. Justin.

Fr Justin Driscoll is facilitating the formation sessions. Fr Justin began the sessions with the anniversary prayer. He included the points below on the Assembly in his introduction.

Why an assembly? Considering Plenary Council Decree 7: At the service of Communion, Participation, and Mission - Governance, Bishop Paul Bird called a Diocesan Assembly on leadership and governance for a synodal church, to coincide with the 150th Anniversary of the Diocese of Ballarat.

Why an Assembly and not a Synod? The Diocese of Ballarat has decided on an assembly as Bishop Paul turned 75 in July and will submit his resignation letter to the Pope. Recommendations from the Assembly can then be the agenda for a Synod, following the appointment of a new Bishop



Who will be at the Assembly? Clergy who serve their community, two delegates from each parish, representatives/delegates from diocesan commissions and committees, health services, aged care, DOBCEL and the education sector, Catholic organisations such St Vincent de Paul, Knights of the Southern Cross, CWL and religious orders.

What is the agenda of the Assembly? The agenda for Assembly is not set at this point. The focus of the Assembly is Leadership and Governance in a synodal Church. These formation sessions will develop the Assembly agenda.
