Pope Francis: Beauty urges us to take Christ into the Street to the People

In a message the pope emphasized the significance of "beauty" in attracting others to faith in Jesus Christ and his Church. "Above all, it is the beauty of Christ that summons us, calls us to be brothers and sisters and urge us to take Christ out into the streets, to bring him to the people, so that everyone can contemplate his beauty," "Be crazy with love," the pope added. "Crazy with love for God, so much so to touch the hearts of their people, to bring them to God."

Pope Franis called on Catholics to become "pilgrims of hope" emphasizing that "hope and kindness touch the very heart of the Gospel." After the opening of the 2025 jubilee Year, the pope emphasized the "kindness is not a diplomatic strategy" nor "a set of rules to ensure social harmony or to obtain other advantages" but rather "a form of love that opens hearts to acceptance and helps us all to become more humble."

Wars, social injustices, and the many forms of violence we are exposed to every day should not dishearten us nor draw us toward scepticism and discouragement."

Speaking about the recently begun jubilee year, Francis concluded with "a wish for hope, which is a theological virtue, together with faith and charity," praying that "the new year bring us peace, fellowship, and gratitude." Pilgrims from around the world have been passing through the open Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica this week, which Pope Francis opened on Christmas Eve to begin the 2025 Jubilee. In his Christmas Day message, Pope Francis recalled, "the door of God's heart is always open; let us return to him. Let us return to the heart that loves us and forgives us."

Caritas Australia has launched an appeal for Vanuatu following two earthquakes in 24 hours, that killed at least 14 people and effected 116,000 people. As rescue efforts continue, the death toll is expected to rise. The Port Vila hospital has been overwhelmed, having also sustained damage resulting in the closure of operating theatres. Two major water reserves that supply Port Vila have also been destroyed, with assessment into water supplies ongoing. Major damage to infrastructure has been sustained, impacting communications, airport runways, bridges. As part of the Church Agencies Network Disaster Operations (CANDO) Caritas Australia will be supporting on the ground through its partners. Sally Thomas, Humanitarian Manager at Caritas Australia said, "Vanuatu, and particularly Port Vila, has been devastated. "As we embrace the festivities, we must remember that our brothers and sisters in Vanuatu, who need our compassion and support as they recover."
