This year being declared the Year of St Joseph by Pope Francis, is a great opportunity to visit & reflect on the "Josephites or Brown Joeys'; the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart, founded by St Mary McKillop in Penola in 1866. LENTEN REGULATIONS - 2021 - Bishop Paul Bird

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence from meat. On all other Fridays, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled through any one of the following:(a)Prayer: for example, Mass attendance; family prayer, a visit to a church or chapel, reading the Bible, making the Stations of the Cross, praying the rosary. (b) Self-denial: for example, not eating meat, not eating sweets or desserts, reducing time for watching TV or other entertainments. (c)Helping others- for example, taking the family to visit the elderly in old people's home or in the parish, visiting the sick or someone who is lonely. All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. (Canon 1252).

PROJECT COMPASSION CALLS ON AUSTRALIANS TO 'BE MORE'.

Compassion: "We're giving them what is their right. We're helping them to have the basic necessities of human life. And that's our duty – if it's their right, it's our duty." Twenty-two-year-old Oliva lives in Tanzania with her farmer husband, two young sons and an adopted niece and nephew. She didn't have the opportunity to go to school growing up - and

adopted niece and nephew. She didn't have the opportunity to go to school growing up - and was embarrassed that she couldn't read, write or count. Around 25 percent of Tanzanian girls and women over 15 years cannot read or write, with many families unable to afford school

fees or uniforms. Now, as an adult, Oliva runs a kiosk and works as a farm labourer - but her business was losing money because she couldn't add up.

Then Oliva enrolled in Caritas Australia-supported literacy and numeracy classes. She also set up a classroom at home to teach her neighbours, for free, because they were too shy to attend larger classes.

Oliva has now graduated, as have some of her students. Attendance at her classes is growing, her kiosk is thriving and she can help her children with their homework. She aims to become a pastor and run for leadership in the next local election. Oliva aspires to "Be More' and wants to help her community to achieve its vision of a better life for all.

"I am proud to be a teacher who helps others to achieve their dream," Oliva says.

POPE FRANCIS' VISIT IS SIGN OF CLOSENESS TO THE CHURCH IN IRAQ.

Pope Francis' first papal Apostolic Journey to Iraq is scheduled to begin on Friday, 5 March. During the four-day visit, the Pope will meet with Christian communities as well as civil and religious authorities. This will be the Holy Father's first trip abroad in

about fifteen months as the outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic and the subsequent restrictions on movement have posed a challenge to external travel. It is also the first-ever papal journey to Iraq. The Apostolic visit begins on Friday morning when the Pope departs from Rome for Baghdad's International Airport. He is slated to visit several cities including Mosul, Qaraqosh and Erbil. Speaking to Vatican News, Cardinal Parolin described the Pope's visit as a sign of his "closeness to the Catholic Church" in the country and to its dwindling Christian communities. "We know that the Church has suffered a lot," Cardinal Parolin said. "It has lost many Christians who have left Iraq for other countries." The Church, therefore, needs the presence of the Holy Father "to be encouraged and to continue her mission of witnessing lesus Christ and the Gospel in the difficult situation in which she finds herself," he said. The presence of Christians in Iraq has significantly diminished in the past two decades. In 2003, before the deposal of Saddam Hussein, there were approximately 1.4 million Christians in the country. However, thousands of Christians were killed and many others fled for their lives in the face of violence and persecution under the 2014 - 2017 occupation of the Plain of Nineveh by the so-called Islamic State. Another positive dimension to the Pope's visit, according to the Cardinal, is to "boost the efforts which have already started to reconstruct the country. These efforts, he said, are carried out on many fronts, and include fighting corruption and sectarianism, and ensuring that everyone is treated equally - "giving to everyone their deserved places in the fabric of society notwithstanding their The Pope's visit, Cardinal Parolin concluded, will be an occasion of "interreligious dialogue, collaboration, understanding and fraternity between Christians and Muslims in view of the good of the country and its brighter future." religious belonging or class." Of major importance also, is the interreligious significance of the Pope's visit.

Nun named to voting position at Vatican praises 'brave' pope.

A French nun who has become the first woman to hold a voting position at the Vatican says her appointment is evidence the "patriarchal mindset is changing" as



more and more women assume high-level decision-making responsibilities in the Catholic hierarchy. Sister Nathalie Becquart said during a news conference that her appointment as an undersecretary in the Vatican's Synod of Bishops office was a "brave signal and prophetic decision"

by Pope Francis who has repeatedly stressed the need for women to have a greater say in church governance.
