October—The Month of the Missions.

In Jesus' mandate: 'Go, then, to all people everywhere and make them my disciples' (Matt 28:19), he is speaking to each one of us. Our responsibility for the proclamation of the

Gospel in other lands is very real and warrants a continuing awareness in our prayer, along with our financial support towards the material needs of those working overseas in other places

proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ. Mission Sunday presents us with the opportunity to give that support.

Violence, and in particular domestic violence, is sadly not uncommon in families around the world. In recent years in Australia significant public campaigns have raised awareness of domestic violence and tried to bring out into the open this often sensitive and stigmatised issue. In Papua New Guinea the trauma of domestic violence is just as real as it is here in Australia. Coupled with poverty and isolation, the effects of domestic violence in Papua New Guinea are especially dire. Furthermore, this issue has yet to become as public in the way Australians are currently experiencing today. However, change is slowly happening.

Mercy Works—an organisation with whom the Catholic Mission partners—works

closely with the local communities in PNG and in recent years, together, they have identified the urgent need to address domestic and family violence. Consequently, two programs have been established: **Family Life** and **Community Advocacy**. These programs raise awareness, support communities and travel with families who are at risk. This life giving and life-changing work is taken to remote areas and villages and is accessible to all.

By supporting Catholic Mission, you will help community leaders in Papua New Guinea receive training and advocate for communities experiencing family and domestic violence, to allow them to find peace through mercy.
