Ribbons on a section of the cathedral fence

Bishop Paul offers this update following discussions about ribbons on the cathedral fence.

In March this year, LOUD fence ribbons were removed from the St Patrick's Cathedral fence following consultations between members of LOUD fence and representatives of St Patrick's Cathedral Parish, to allow maintenance work to be undertaken.

In 2015, during the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse, the LOUD fence began tying ribbons to fences in Ballarat and beyond, as a sign of solidarity and support for those who suffered child sexual abuse in institutional settings.

While maintenance work was undertaken, Parish Council and LOUD fence representatives began discussions for a long-term memorial on the grounds of St Patrick's Cathedral to acknowledge victim survivors, their loved ones and supporters who experienced child sexual abuse in church settings and elsewhere.

We hope that the memorial will provide ongoing recognition of those who experience the ongoing impacts of child sexual abuse, be a reminder for the continuing attention to safeguarding children and vulnerable people in the community and promote healing across the Ballarat community.

With maintenance work on the fence completed, Bishop Paul, together with representatives of the Parish Council and LOUD fence have announced a next step to be taken while discussions about a long-term memorial continue. As an interim arrangement, ribbons will be placed on a dedicated section of the cathedral fence on Sturt Street.

Parish representatives will gather with LOUD fence members at 11 am on Saturday July 6 to tie ribbons to the dedicated section of fence. Parishioners and LOUD fence invite anyone who wishes, to tie a ribbon as a sign of support for victim/survivors, their loved ones, and supporters and as a reminder for continuing to safeguard children and vulnerable people everywhere.

Reflection on the Gospel- Fourteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time Year B (Mark 6:1-6) - Mary Coloe PBVM

We tend to think that Jesus was able to do everything he set out to do, that his ministry was super successful but today's Gospel shows us that Jesus too had his 'bad days'. After much success around Galilee Jesus goes home, but his own village does not give him a 'ticker-tape' welcome. No sign up saying 'Local boy makes good'. Instead, the very fact that he is a local is an obstacle. Can't you hear them say, 'He can't be that special, I was better than him in Hebrew classes!' So this village missed out. No miracles there. The text doesn't say 'Jesus would not work any miracle there', but that 'he could not'. The lack of openness and scepticism of these villagers blocked God's power in Jesus' life. They didn't want God in the form of Jesus, the son of Mary and Joseph; they wanted something more special. Jesus was just too ordinary, too familiar to them to be taken seriously.

This is not just a problem in Nazareth. Here in Australia, we are not good at offering appreciation for the skills or gifts of another. Some say we have 'a tall poppy' syndrome, where we cut everyone down to size. What would it be like if instead 'cutting down' we encouraged and built up one another, and also allowed our own particular strengths to flourish? What change might happen in our families or work places if we noticed and more readily complimented others? Just a few words could make a big difference to another person, and cost us nothing.

So, where do you look for God? Is it possible that you are missing God's presence because it is too simple, too ordinary, and not dramatic enough? God is there perhaps in the words, 'sorry mum', or 'this is great work' or 'how was your day'. Don't look for angels, or burning bushes, or strange visions; look for God in the ordinary gift of life imbued with God's presence. And watch out for the prophet in your midst, among your family, within your household. Open up to the miracles in the ordinary, and try to help some 'poppies' flourish.


