JUSTICE MATTERS

Welcome to our new column where we will discuss issues of justice in our world and how it relates to Catholic Social Teaching.

What is Catholic Social Teaching?

Catholic Social Teaching sums up the teachings of the Church on issues of justice between groups in society. It seeks to bring the light of the Gospel to bear on the social justice issues that arise in the complex network of relationships in which we live.

Catholic Social Teaching promotes a vision of a just society that is grounded

in biblical revelation, the teachings of the leaders of the early church, and in

the wisdom gathered from experience by the Christian community as it has

tried to respond to social justice issues through history. It draws on the sources of Scripture, tradition, reason and experience.

Over the coming weeks, we will look at justice issues and how it effects are sisters and brothers.

Justice and Christian Living

This week the Parish Council listed the things that our parish is doing in support of the Church's preferential option for the poor. Would you like to support one or more of these efforts?

Mosque: Over 18 months we have raised \$8,000 for the about-to-be-built mosque in Ararat. We have had the local Muslims proclaim their sacred scripture from our pulpit. We are making a deliberate effort to promote friendship and good will.

Prisoners: We continue to serve the prisoners with six parishioners involved in this ministry.

Refugees: We continue to have a number of parishioners involved with our Rural Australians for Refugees group and have offered them office / storage space in our presbytery alongside the parish office. Our belief is that the RAR are teaching us valuable lessons about being church.

East Timor: Over 12 months we have hosted two fundraising efforts for people in East Timor.

Women: We are currently collecting handbags and filling them with goods for women under the "Share the Dignity" initiative. The parish priest proudly claims to have just purchased \$100 worth of tampons, something he had never done before! We are making a particular effort to befriend the Muslim women in our community.

India: The Lake Bolac community has been collecting for Sr Gottfrieda's mission in India for 30 years. In addition to money there is regular correspondence as to what is happening in the mission.

Alienation and Poverty: The parish receives some recompense for the time given to prison ministry. This money is used to address the existence of alienation and poverty, which often become the catalysts for prison sentencing. Money has gone to the mosque, East Timor, Share the Dignity.

Asylum Seekers: Sr Brigid Arthur is coming to speak to the parish and to help us to place the plight of refugees and asylum seekers into a Christian framework. Fr Andrew is setting up a series of fundraising concerts for asylum seekers.

The Recycling Nun: Sr John Spurr is the angel of recycling at Marian College. She is often to be found upended in wheelie bins sorting the recycling. Sr John is the key driver of the environmental face of justice. Her coffee mug is a recycling bin!

Sunday Bulletin: It is envisaged that we will have regular awareness raising articles on the weekly bulletin. Education is important.

Vinnies: Our parishioners continue to have a very active Vinnies Conference and Shop including sharing the emergency care duties among the churches.


