LIGHTING OF ADVENT WREATH

Priest: Let us now pray for God's blessing upon us and upon this wreath.

PAUSE IN SILENCE

All: Lord God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: hope of the peoples, the Saviour of every nation. You ask us to be watchful and alert because we do not know when you will come.

Let this candle bring us light and call us to a new wakefulness. At those times when you ask us to act, give us strength to respond at once.

Priest: Loving God, let your blessing come upon us gathered around this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord. *All*: **Amen.**

THREE CANDLES ARE LIT


All: Loving God, You call us all to be your people united in faith. We thank you for this wreath, the evergreen sign of your faithful love.

HISTORY OF THE CHRISTMAS TREE

When St Boniface evangelised the German people in the eighth century, he took an axe to Donar's Oak to break the pagan reverence for 'sacred trees.' According to legend, an




Many centuries later, Christians in central Europe revived the old Roman custom of bringing an evergreen tree into the home each December. The Romans' pagan beliefs were supplanted by the legend of St Boniface and the Trinitarian tree. An angel, representing Gabriel at the Annunciation, or a star, representing the Star of Bethlehem, was placed at the top of the tree. What began as a Protestant custom was soon adopted by Catholics too. In 1982, Pope St John Paul II inaugurated the now annual practice of erecting a Christmas Tree in St Peter's Square to accompany the Vatican Nativity Scene.

In some places the Christmas Tree is erected at the start of Advent; in others on Christmas Eve.

Traditionally, it is not removed until 6th January — the Feast of Epiphany, and the twelfth day of Christmas.

VISITATION OF THE RELIC OF BLESSED CARLO ACUTIS

Pope Francis recently announced his intention to canonise Carlo Acutis next April. A gamer and computer programmer who loved



the Eucharist, he will be the first millennial saint.

Later this month, the Buronga Latin Mass Community is organising a visitation of a relic of Blessed Carlo and a display of his *Eucharistic Miracles of the World* exhibition.

NEW PRIEST'S FIRST BLESSING

It is an old tradition of the faithful to request "a first blessing" from a newlyordained priest. People often queue up after an

ordination or a new priest's Mass of Thanksgiving to receive the blessing, which affords special graces.

The first blessing can be ministered any time in the first 12 months after a priest's ordination. Fr Cay is happy to minister the blessing to anyone who asks.

Traditionally, a person kneels for the first blessing, and then kisses the palms of the priest's consecrated hands afterwards. But it is also fine to stand and bow your head to receive the blessing, and you don't have to kiss Fr Cay's hands.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

What, then, must we do?

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.
