SCRIPTURE REFLECTION by Fr Francis Fernandez

WORK UNTIL THE LORD'S COMING

In these final Sundays of the liturgical year, the Church invites the faithful to meditate on the Last Things. In today's First Reading the Prophet Malachi speaks in the most graphic terms of the end of time: *"The day is coming now, burning like a furnace; and all the arrogant and the evil-doers will be like stubble. The day that is coming is going to burn them up, says the Lord of Hosts, leaving them neither root nor stalk."* Jesus warns us in today's Gospel that we must be alert for his coming again: *"The time is near at hand."*

There were some Christians in the early Church who believed that the Second Coming was very imminent. They became so preoccupied about the

approaching end of the world that they stopped bothering about practicalities, living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. St Paul laments this situation in today's Second Reading. He gives the faithful a memorable precept: *"Do not let anyone have any food if he refuses to do any work."* To those with nothing to do, St Paul says: *"In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat."*

Life is short, and our encounter with Jesus is near. Some time in the future He will come in glory, and our bodies will be resurrected. These considerations should move us to become detached from earthly goods, to make good use of our time, to be doing a lively apostolate in the middle of the world. We must have our eyes set on Heaven, but at the same time, we need to have our feet firmly planted on earth. The Second Vatican Council was very insistent on the value of human work: *"This Council exhorts Christians, as citizens*

of two cities, to strive to discharge their earthly duties conscientiously and in response to the Gospel spirit. They are mistaken who, knowing that we have here no abiding city but seek one which is to come, think that they may therefore shirk their earthly responsibilities. For they are forgetting that by the faith itself they are more obliged than ever to measure up to these duties, each according to his proper vocation." These words summarize the imitation of Christ for the modern laity.

We should work with intensity to give glory to God, to provide for the needs of our family, to improve our society. If we are not engaged in conscientious work, in some real service to others, how are we to sanctify ourselves in the middle of the world? It is only logical that for work to be acceptable to God it must first be acceptable to our neighbours. Looking at things with complete impartiality, let us each ask ourselves: *Am I really earning my salary or my wage?*
