## FROM OUR ASSISTANT PRIEST

This week Fr Matthew is leading the St Joseph's College Year 12 students on a retreat in Anglesea. Let's pray all the students and staff involved received an abundance of good resolutions and inspirations to sustain them for the final sprint towards VCE exams and graduation.

Please note that this week's Mass schedule is far from usual, owing not only to Fr Matt's retreat, but also to Tuesday's Council of Priests, and a number of funerals. Note, too, the changes to next Sunday's Mass schedule.

The scene in today's Gospel is the only time we see Jesus sleeping. He was so tired the storm could not wake him — but the Apostles did! St Thérèse of Lisieux wrote a beautiful meditation on this point: "Far from experiencing any consolation in prayer, complete aridity - desolation, almost - was my lot. Jesus was asleep in my little boat as usual. How rarely souls let Him sleep peacefully within them. Their agitation and all their requests have so tired out the Good Master that He is only too glad to enjoy the rest I offer Him. I do not suppose He will wake up until my eternal retreat, but instead of making me sad, it makes me very happy."

We are quick to wake the Lord and complain about life's storms. But every storm has meaning; we must pray to find the clues. We will either collapse or we'll grow with the Lord.

# JUBILEE YEAR 2025 "PILGRIMS OF HOPE"

Pope Francis has announced that 2025 will be a Jubilee Year, with the theme "Pilgrims of Hope." In



the lead-up to the Jubilee Year, Pope Francis has asked that 2024 be marked as a Year of Prayer, to promote the centrality of individual and community prayer. The Holy See has made some useful resources available to help people better understand and rediscover the value of prayer. In addition to the 38 catecheses on Prayer that Pope Francis himself presented, a series of booklets entitled, "Notes on Prayer" is being published. The eight titles are designed to put the need for a profound relationship with the Lord back at the centre of people's lives, through the many forms of prayer to be found in the rich Catholic tradition of prayer. In addition, a pastoral aid is available online, in a digital version, to help parish communities, families, priests, cloistered nuns and young people to become more aware of the need for daily prayer. ## FIRST READING

Job 38:1, 8-11

From the heart of the tempest the Lord gave Job his answer. He said:

Who pent up the sea behind closed doors when it leapt tumultuous out of the womb, when I wrapped it in a robe of mist and made black clouds its swaddling bands; when I marked the bounds it was not to cross and made it fast with a bolted gate? Come thus far, I said, and no farther: here your proud waves shall break.

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them.

From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in

Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here.

Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'
