

FROM OUR ASSISTANT PRIEST

Please note that Fr Matt's absence this week has impacted the weekday Mass schedule. Monday happens to be the thirteenth anniversary of my ordination, so I am celebrating a 9:30am Mass that day.

In today's Gospel Jesus asks an unexpected question: "Who do people say that I am?" The Apostles repeat speculative gossip that isn't so different from what we hear today. In the modern imagination, who is Jesus? A wise guru? A social activist? A religious reformer? Only faithful Christians will say that he is the Son of God — and God Himself.

Then Jesus gets personal: "But who do you say that I am?" It is a good question to ask ourselves in our prayer. People in love are always asking this question, checking in with their lover. Who is Jesus to me?

On one occasion Jesus appeared to St Catherine of Siena and asked her two questions in one: "Do you know who you are and who I am?" The questions are interrelated. Hence St Paul declares, "It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me."

Jesus appeared to St Thomas Aguinas towards the end of his life and said: "You have written well of me Thomas. What reward shall I give you?" Thomas replied: "Lord, all I want is you." I'm not there yet, but what an attitude to aspire toward!






OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY FESTA

Isaiah 50:5-9

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

I offered my back to those who struck me.

The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away.

brothers or one of the sisters is in need of clothes and has not enough food to live on, and one of you says to them, 'I wish you well; keep yourself warm and eat plenty,' without giving them these bare necessities of life, then what good is that? Faith is like that: if good works do not go with it, it is quite

This is the way to talk to people of that kind: 'You say you have faith and I have good deeds; I will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds - now you prove to me that you have faith without any good deeds to show.'

GOSPEL

Mark 8:27-35

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

The Son of Man is destined to suffer grievously.

Jesus and his disciples left for the villages round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' And they told him. 'John the Baptist,' they said, 'others Elijah; others again, one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he asked, 'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again; and he said all this guite openly. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. But, turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said to him, 'Get behind me, Satan! Because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

He called the people and his disciples to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.'
