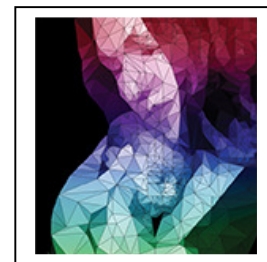

Church without Frontiers, Mother to All - 101st World Day of Migrants and Refugees

The Holy Father, Pope Francis, in his message for the 101st World Day of Migrants and Refugees, 2015, has chosen the theme “Church without frontiers, Mother to all”. It is part of our Christian mandate from Jesus Christ to care for others and in particular the most vulnerable (c.f. Mt 7:12 and 25:35-36). The Holy Father, wishing to draw attention to and remind us of this, has chosen this theme. He wishes us to go beyond ourselves, to live an authentic Christian life, and show compassion and solidarity to those at the furthest fringes of society. In particular, Pope Francis has identified migrants and refugees to be in need of our special attention and care, as they are our brothers and sisters “*who are trying to escape difficult living conditions and dangers of every kind.*” (Message, 2015). The Holy Father mentions that, “*from the beginning, the Church has been a mother with a heart open to the whole world, and has been without borders.*” (Message, 2015).

We need to continue this tradition and welcome our brothers and sisters who are in most need of our assistance, in particular, those who have come from distant lands seeking a better life. Whilst the plight of refugees is often present and visible on our television screens, let us not forget the difficulties faced by the many migrants who have come to call Australia home. Often their hardships are not evident, but nonetheless still present.

In this message, I would like to draw your attention to the on-going conflict in the Middle East and the issues closer to home faced by asylum seekers, as well as the often-unseen difficulties faced by migrants in our communities.

- Three million refugees have been produced by the Syrian war;
- Six and a half million, or one-third, of Syrian people are displaced;
- Half of these refugees are children.

Stewardship Renewal

As the first step in the renewal of Parish Stewardship (October 2015) a Parish Census is being taken at Masses last weekend and this weekend. Redevelopment of the Halls

With work almost completed on the former O'Collins Hall site (the smaller hall) with new toilets, a redeveloped Dawson St end (including a ramp) for the St Vincent de Paul Relief Centre, an open weekend will be held for all parishioners to walk through before it becomes occupied. The centre will be open after all Masses next weekend, September 5th – 6th with a blessing by Bishop Paul after 10.30 am Confirmation Mass and the monthly first Sunday of the month cuppa.

Cathedral Precinct

This group meet to explore the Jubilee Year of Mercy with conversation on the development of a place of reflection and contemplation behind the Cathedral (Lyons St end) that will be a quiet space for the City of Ballarat which will promote healing and reconciliation. Exploration of possibilities continues ... To join this conversation contact Jacinta in the Cathedral Parish Office. As part of the *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, commencing in December 2015, it is proposed to open a *Door of Mercy* making the Cathedral more accessible and welcoming from the Sturt St side. The gate from Sturt St into the Cathedral grounds, which at that point needs repair (asphalting needed to make safe) will be opened leading to the *Door of Mercy*. The Reconciliation Chapel will need to be relocated and made more transparent for access to the Cathedral from the *Door of Mercy*.

Annual Collection for Sick and Retired Priests 5th - 6th September

Eighteen retired priests are currently supported by this Fund. Some live privately, some are retired in units in Ballarat North or elsewhere, others live in supported accommodation. The funding required for these commitments is ongoing. Thanks to your generosity, this collection has raised nearly 1.7 million dollars since it began in 1991, including nearly \$67,000 last year. Along with the priests' own contribution of approximately \$40,000 per year, this annual collection has allowed the Fund to continue to support our sick and retired clergy. A credit card facility is available for your convenience, and contributions over \$2.00 are tax-deductible. Envelopes will be available.
