The House of Welcome Ballarat held its annual soup luncheon fundraiser for refugees at Nazareth House Hall on June 20. Refugee Week 2018 is celebrated from June 17 to June 23. House of Welcome founder and organiser, Carmel Kavanagh said about one hundred people attended, including guest dancers. She said some people sent donations instead and that it was "a lovely social occasion" attended by many of the city's multicultural groups.
