"Holding the Light" Remembering Victims and Survivors of Family Violence

This ecumenical service offers an opportunity to remember and mourn those who have been killed as a result of domestic violence, to stand in solidarity with victim survivors and to reflect and commit ourselves to addressing the causes of violence in our communities. The service will be held on *Tuesday December 10th at St Alipius Church, Ballarat East at 5.00pm.* December 10th is the UN Human Rights Day, concluding the 16 days of Activism against gender-based violence campaign from November 25th (International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women). Joce Bignold, CEO of McAuley Community Services for Women will be the guest speaker. All members of the community are welcome!

Clergy Appointments: Following the appointment of Fr Andrew Hayes as Parish Priest of the Parishes of Apollo Bay, Cororooke & Colac, Bishop Paul has appointed Fr Neville Stanislaus, Parish Priest of Gariwerd (Ararat, Lake Bolac, Landsborough & Stawell) from January 15th. Priests of the Diocese have now been invited to express interest in being appointed Parish Priest of the Parishes of Camperdown (Cobden & Lismore), Hampden (Mortlake & Terang) and Timboon

(& Simpson). These three parishes will form a Ministry District, cared for by one Parish Priest, with the assistance of another priest or priests who will help particularly with Sunday Masses.

Bishop Paul writes on the High Court Judgement and Vicarious liability

In cases where there is evidence that the Diocese of Ballarat has been negligent in the duty of safeguarding children, the Diocese accepts liability and provides compensation to victims.

In the case considered by the High Court, Victorian courts had found that the Diocese of Ballarat was not negligent but still held that the Diocese was liable – vicariously. The High Court set aside this decision of the Victorian courts.

I would like to make it clear that the Diocese of Ballarat will continue to accept liability and provide compensation in cases where there is evidence that the Diocese has been negligent in safeguarding. In addition, the Diocese will continue to provide compensation through the Federal Government's Redress Scheme and through the state-wide Church process called Pathways Victoria. As well as providing compensation in these ways, the Diocese will continue to provide assistance to those who have suffered abuse by funding counselling and other pastoral help.

More From the Diocesan Assembly:

A formal report on the Assembly held at Federation University Mt Helen on Leadership and Governance for a Missionary Synodal Church will be released in the coming weeks. In the meantime, our newsletters for the coming weeks will include reflections from parishioners in attendance as either delegates or facilitators.

The Assembly gave me hope. I went, not sure where we were going, but ready to trust the process. I made a commitment to myself to be open to the promptings of the Spirit and the 'word' coming from the gathered members. I believe the Spirit was present and active. Some aspects of people's behaviour and attitudes disappointed me but remembering that I did not have to control the responses of others was liberating. The Diocese of Ballarat has chosen a direction from which we cannot turn back. No matter how small nor how faltering the steps we take from here on, our public, diocesan-wide resolution cannot be ignored, nor can it be negated. The Wild Goose will ultimately have her way.

My prayer now is not 'Come, Holy Spirit' but 'Stay, Holy Spirit, and continue to chase us'.
